Service settings and places regulated by CSSIW, 31 March 2014

This first release summarises information on the numbers of service settings and places that are regulated by the Care and Social Services Inspectorate for Wales (CSSIW). The release presents key results for Wales at 31 March 2014 (January to March quarter 2014) and includes comparisons with figures for the end of earlier quarters. Registration, de-registration and changes to registration occur throughout the year although in general the number of settings registered at any one time is fairly consistent.

Further information for individual local authorities and setting types is published on the Welsh Government's statistics dissemination tool StatsWales.

Key results at 31 March 2014:

- 6,274 service settings were regulated by CSSIW at 31 March 2014, an increase of 92 from 6,182 service settings at 31 December 2013.
- 105,006 places were registered with CSSIW at 31 March 2014, an increase of 68 places since the end of the previous quarter.

- 4,446 children's day care service settings were regulated by CSSIW at 31 March 2014, a small increase from 4,359 service settings at the end of the previous quarter.
- 76,590 children's day care places were registered with CSSIW at 31 March 2014, an increase of 82 since the end of the previous quarter.

Glossary

Places	Some settings and services are registered to provide care for a maximum number of people – the number of registered places. Places are not registered in domiciliary care, nurses' agencies, adult placement schemes and those settings and services that CSSIW do not register (see "Registration").
Provider	An organisation or individual who delivers a regulated social care or early years service.
Registration	<p>CSSIW decides who can provide social care services. Before some regulated services can begin to operate, they must register with CSSIW. The services included are:</p> <p>Older and younger adult care homes, domiciliary care agencies, children's homes, public sector and independent fostering agencies, public sector and voluntary adoption agencies, childminders and crèches.</p> <p>Note that local authority fostering agencies, local authority adoption agencies, boarding schools, residential special schools and further education colleges are not registered with CSSIW but they are regulated by CSSIW (see 'Regulation').</p>
Regulation	<p>This is the process CSSIW use to make professional assessments and judgements about social care and early years services and so encourage improvement by the setting and service providers. Regulation includes: Registration – CSSIW decide who can provide services; Inspection – CSSIW inspect those services and publish reports; Concerns and complaints - CSSIW are keen to receive information about care services registered with us, including concerns or complaints, in order to ensure that services are safe and provide good quality care; Compliance – CSSIW support compliance with the regulations; and Enforcement – CSSIW take enforcement action to make sure that the requirements of the Care Standards Act 2000, the Children Act 1989, the Children and Families (Wales) Measure 2010 and the Adoption and Children Act 2002 and its associated regulations are met.</p>
Regulations	<p>These are the rules based on and meant to carry out a specific piece of legislation. Regulations are set by government to achieve its objectives and are enforced by regulators such as CSSIW. CSSIW delivers regulation on behalf of Welsh Minister under the terms of the regulations associated with the Care Standards Act 2000, the Children Act 1989, the Children and Families (Wales) Measure 2010 and the Adoption and Children Act 2002.</p>
Service settings	This is a collective name for an organisation or individuals regulated by CSSIW.

Children's day care	Includes the following services: Full Day Care Childminders Out of School Care Sessional Day Care Crèches Open Access
Children's services	Includes the following services: Children's Homes Residential Family Centres Public sector and independent fostering agencies Public sector and voluntary adoption agencies Boarding schools which accommodate students under 18 Residential special schools which accommodate students under 18 Further education colleges which accommodate students under 18 Secure unit (included in figures for children's homes due to small numbers)
Adults' services	Includes the following services: Older Adult Care Homes (65 years old and over) Younger Adult Care Homes (under 65 years old) Adult Placement Schemes Domiciliary Care Agencies Nurses' Agencies

Notes

1. Source of statistics

The Care and Social Services Inspectorate Wales (CSSIW) encourages the improvement of social care, early years and social services by:

- regulating
- inspecting and reviewing
- providing professional advice to Ministers and policy makers.

The information in this brief is derived from the administrative system used by CSSIW to register and regulate care settings. The information only relates to regulated settings. CSSIW is in the process of reviewing the regulatory process and systems.

2. Timing

CSSIW's administrative system is continually updated as part of the inspectorate's day to day work of regulation. Publication relates to snapshots of the system taken on a quarterly basis throughout the financial year. Therefore published information is available for the end of

- Quarter 1 (April to June), that is 30 June
- Quarter 2 (July to September), that is 30 September
- Quarter 3 (October to December), that is 31 December

- Quarter 4 (January to March), that is 31 March

3. Data quality

Registration, de-registration and changes to registration occur throughout the year although in general the number of settings registered at any one time is fairly consistent.

Some of the data in this release may have been revised since its last publication in the Chief Inspector's 2010-11 annual report.

4. Symbols

The following notation is used in these tables:

- . = the data item is not applicable
- .. = the data item is not available
- = the data item is not exactly zero, but estimated as zero or less than half the final digit shown
- * = the data item is disclosive or not sufficiently robust for publication

5. Disclosure and rounding

Rounding has not been applied to the information in these tables or the supporting tables on StatsWales. This is because this information can also be found on CSSIW's Directory of Regulated Services (see item 9).

6. Revisions policy

As data is taken from an administrative system and gives a picture of activity recorded at a specific date, data will not be revised each quarter. This picture may not be exact as information may not be entered on the system until a later date (i.e. next quarter) and the next quarter may include some data from the previous quarter that was recorded 'late'. However, the number of cases involved is likely to be small.

7. Uses of statistics

We believe the key users of information on regulated settings in Wales (apart from CSSIW's core use) are:

- Welsh Government Ministers
- Department for Health and Social Services
- Assembly Members and the Members' Research Service in the National Assembly for Wales
- National Health Service
- The Office for National Statistics
- Local government unitary authorities (elected members and officials)
- Students, academics and universities,
- Other areas of the Welsh Government
- Other government departments
- Individual citizens and private companies.

Apart from CSSIW's core use of the information these statistics are used in a variety of ways. Some examples of these include:

- Advice to Ministers
- Unitary authority comparisons and benchmarking
- To inform debate in the National Assembly for Wales and beyond
- To provide information to commissioners of care services
