During 2013-14 we received 2,170 concerns.

We carried out 284 additional inspections as a result of the concerns raised.

If you have a complaint about a local authority-you should contact the Public Services Ombudsman for Wales.

If you have a complaint about a social care worker- You should contact the Care Council for Wales.

We need you to help us close the gap on bad care...

And be our eyes and ears on the ground.

If you see bad care-Tell us.
